Lincoln Community Forest

- 396 acres wild and scenic hardwood and conifer forest in the Town of Lincoln, Bayfield County
- Scenic and rugged terrain of high bluffs and deep valleys and 2 ½ miles of the Marengo River
- 10 acre lake and numerous forest wetlands
- Open to everyone for nature-based recreation (hunting, fishing, hiking, cross country skiing)
- Titled to BRC, managed in partnership with FLCF

The Friends of the Lincoln Community Forest (FLCF) is a non-profit organization that incorporated in March 2013

Mission: To facilitate the conservation and enjoyment of the Lincoln Community Forest

Vision: We envision the Lincoln Community Forest and Marengo River within as a community asset:

- That is rigorously managed throughout
 - to ensure a healthy, sustainable & scenic forest,
 - to protect its natural and historic character.
- That provides in the South Unit a small network of primitive trails where the visitor can enjoy nature-based recreation.
- That preserves the North Unit in a largely undeveloped state.






Mikinaak Lake




Two new Leopold-style cedar benches along the ski and hiking trails, and named trails


















Groom >2 miles of trails for cross-country skiing.

Established long term water quality monitoring stations where we collect data throughout the year for Superior Rivers Watershed Association








Held our first annual member appreciation and fundraising picnic, raised nearly \$1,500








Grew the Forest Forever Fund.

BRC Marengo River Rd Timber Sale



- 23 acres along >½ mile Boulevard trail
- Removed 600 cords aspen
- Negotiated leaving 133 cords mixed hardwoods
- Cost Friends Group \$2,000











Projects and events (2018)

- Complete construction on a second safe nesting site for turtles
- Install bat houses at 2 locations
- Host Birding and Nature Festival hike on May 19 and Public Lands Day hike on Sept 22
- Plant and maintain spruce and oak trees in harvest area
- Plant and maintain shrubbery screen for turtle sites
- Repair rutting from logging operations
- Continue trail maintenance and improvements
- Continue collecting water quality samples
- 2nd annual fundraising picnic on June 30
- Campaign to reach the \$25,000 goal in FFF endowment
- Host education programs at venues off the Forest
